Affectionately known as **'The Bobbo'** – Is an annual community fundraising cycle ride for Lifeline



Mother's Day Comes to Hornsby Connect

Hornsby Connect set up a stall and these great ranges of handbags were given out to celebrate All Mothers by Year 10 Barker Students who volunteer their time every second week to help out in the local community.

Share the Dignity's 'It's in the Bag' campaign is an opportunity to ensure women receive a gift, as a reminder that somebody cares and they're not alone.

The 'It's in the Bag' campaign has a simple premise:

Donate a handbag that you no longer use, fill it with items that would be gratefully received by a homeless woman – things such as pads, tampons, deodorants, toothpaste, shower gel, socks, a brush, a magazine, anything that would make a woman or teenage girl who is struggling feel special.
